Twila was an unassuming kind of person. Simple and kind, her trailer home was tucked into the rural landscape of Colcord, Oklahoma — a setting familiar to several Kind at Heart clients.

Like many widows living on a fixed income, she had little support available to her. And truthfully, Twila preferred to handle things on her own . . . until she couldn't.

The threshold between her living room and kitchen was becoming a daily source of fear. The old linoleum was peeling and splitting — a small detail to some. But to Twila it was a reminder that tripping leads to falling, and falling leads to injuries that can change everything. That's when she first reached out for help.

That worn threshold became both a literal and figurative picture of what help from a community looks like. She went from having little support to having an "army" of helpers showing up at her front door.



### **Mobility Support**

Skilled volunteers repaired Twila's threshold (2022) and later built her a sturdy ramp as she began using a walker (2023). A handicapaccessible shower was installed the year after that (2024), providing Twila with safe access to dignified self-care.



#### **Connection & Encouragement**

Twila became a recipient of regular visits and seasonal deliveries - Valentines, Christmas, and Garden goodies. These volunteer-driven visits provided her with regular check-ins & were a huge source of encouragement.



#### A Community's Mission

Service teams were frequent visitors to Twila's home. They stained/maintained her ramp more than once and provided support with yard cleanup.
