Last August, we received a call from a woman whose mother—who we'll call **Lisa**—was preparing to return home after a serious fall.

Suddenly, the home she had lived in for years had become filled with obstacles. Together with volunteers and community partners, we built a wheelchair ramp, installed grab bars, modified her bathroom, and adapted her laundry area so she could continue caring for herself independently.

As volunteers completed the project, they noticed Lisa's front porch had also needed attention. What wasn't included in the original plan soon became another opportunity to serve. Volunteers returned to power wash and stain the porch, transforming it into a welcoming space once again. What began as a safety project became something much bigger—a reminder that Lisa wasn't facing this journey alone.

At Kind at Heart, every project is just the beginning. A safer home opens the door to lasting relationships, continued support, and a community that walks alongside our seniors.

Lisa's story reflects what we see time and again. What starts as a single project often opens the door to lasting connections and continued care. As relationships are built, new opportunities emerge to provide encouragement, practical support, and hope. Kind at Heart is built around observing and meeting needs.
